




v4 only traffic - average traffic jumped ~33% in the new year




New Member Connections HE Effect on v6 Traffic





- We underestimated the volume of back-end work required

- Auto-generation of many services affected
 - can't just switch them over at the start
 - need services and monitoring visibility of both address ranges during the migration window
 - => second IXP Manager installation in parallel



- Development work required:
 - Plan to provide a config migration script
 - Script to open a ticket for each member and confirm receipt
 - Database scripts to update IP addresses
